

## Firsthand Lexus LS430: Tips, Tricks, Tidbits



Joshua Landau of JML Audio in St. Louis, Mo., shares with us some ideas of where things can go in the seldom-seen (by installers) Lexus LS430.



Aftermarket integration is fairly simple, as the factory six-disc changer can be removed and replaced with a standard ISO mount aftermarket radio. Joshua notes that the aftermarket radio can mount with factory screw holes but the dash bezel needs to be widened slightly. Joshua

also notes that some motorized face radios may not fit properly. Another cool aspect is that the factory trim piece still flips up for a stealth look.



Here is a great place for a satellite radio controller in the sunglass holder. The factory pocket will still flip up for a stealth look.



Here is a great place for a customer's iPod.



Here you can see a bunch of aftermarket equipment installed: Satellite radio controller up high, aftermarket head unit down low, and an iPod on the center console. Joshua also made some custom kick panels and a-pillar tweeter pods.
